LEAD BY EXAMPLE IN CLISSOLD PARK

Clissold Park is a place for the whole community and dogs are welcome here.

Hackney Council expects dog owners to be responsible so that all users can enjoy the park.

Respect the park and other users:

- You are responsible for your dog's actions.
- Keep your dog in sight and under control at all times and, if necessary, put it on a lead.
- Remember that other park users, particularly children, may be afraid of your dog.
- Don't allow your dog to run and jump on other people or dogs without an invitation.
- Make sure your dog does not chase or harass wildlife.
- Don't allow your dog to enter the river or lakes. This is to prevent harm to wildlife and to protect your dog from danger or injury.
- Don't take your dog into the play area or other dog free areas.
- Keep your dog on a lead on the café terrace, carriageway and grass slope at the front of Clissold House.

Hackney Council has enforcement powers in place to promote responsible dog ownership.

Dog owners must:

- Clean up after their dogs – dog fouling is unpleasant and can cause a danger to health.
- Keep dogs out of playgrounds and sports areas.
- Put their dogs on leads when asked by a Council officer.

People who do not follow these guidelines could be given a fine of £80 which could rise to £1,000 if unpaid.
